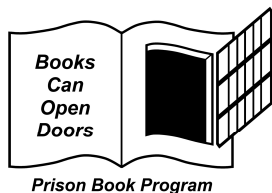

Prison Book Program gives books to individual prisoners in the United States. We do so because education is a powerful tool that reduces the likelihood that a prisoner will return to the prison system. We have been sending books to prisoners since 1972.

PBP works to fill your book requests as quickly as possible. Sometimes, we receive such a large quantity of letters that your request may be delayed anywhere from 5 – 7 months. Please be patient with us. Requests are filled in the order that they are received.

PBP's library varies greatly. Our ability to fill requests depends on what books we have in-stock at the time your request is filled. Go ahead and ask us for any subject/author even if it is not listed below, because you might just get lucky! We try to make the following categories available:

- Dictionaries, Thesauruses, or Reference

- Education: Math, Science, Reading or Writing (*Please let us know what grade level would be best fit for you (for example: grade 1 - 12, GED, college, or professional)*)
- History: USA, Military, World, European, (Auto)Biography, or Current Events
- Career/Resume, Business, Trade Skills, Economics, or Computers
- Health, Medical, or Exercise
- Self-Help/Psychology (general, abuse, addictions, death/dying, Adult Children of ..., or relationships)
- Social Sciences: Political Science, Sociology, Anthropology, Archeology, or Philosophy
- Foreign Language
- Culture or Ethnic Studies (African, African American, Asian, Native American, Latin American, etc.).
- Religion or Spirituality Studies
- Art, Film & Television, Music, Sports, or Hobbies (various)
- Fiction: short stories, classics, general, SciFi/fantasy, thrillers, easy readers, drama, poetry, or plays

PBP does not often have Bibles, real estate, small business start-up, chess, drawing, specific laws, almanacs, mythology, Wiccan, Freemasonry, ancient history, medical or Spanish/English dictionaries, GLBT, large print (of any kind), romances, westerns, or urban fiction.

Please provide us with at least 3 subjects to choose from. If your 1st choice is not in-stock, we will send our closest substitute and/or try to find your 2nd or 3rd choice. If looking for a specific author, please provide the type of books they write.

PLEASE HELP US HELP YOU:

- ❖ Print your full name, ID #, and address in the body of your letter as well as in the return address of the envelope. Please PRINT clearly.
- ❖ Tell us the exact restrictions your facility places on your incoming book packages (for example: paperback only, hardcover okay, maximum #, new books only, newish or good condition okay, no dictionary, invoice required, or prior approval needed, etc.).
- ❖ Only one dictionary per person will be honored.
- ❖ We send books to prisoners only --- no libraries or administrators.
- ❖ Stamps, pre-stamped envelopes and self-addressed stamped envelopes (SASE) are welcomed, but are not required.
- ❖ We ship our packages via United States Postal Service, “media mail” rate.
- ❖ Please write to us no more than once every 6 months, because we have a limited budget.

- ❖ We do not have a catalog, offer pen-pal services, or maintain a mailing list.
- ❖ We do not send books to California, Illinois, Maryland (except Jessup, Cumberland, & Hagerstown), Michigan, Nevada, Texas, & certain individual prisons.

WHO WAS LUCY PARSONS?

Lucy Parsons (1853 - 1942) was a radical American labor organizer, anarchist, and remembered as a powerful public speaker. She was born in Texas (likely as a slave) to the parents of Native American, African American, and Mexican ancestry. Because of her singular fight against social and economic oppression, Lucy led a controversial life. Lucy Parsons always kept a sharp eye on the social revolution that she was convinced was necessary to change what she saw as the glaring excesses of the oppressive capitalist system.

Lucy Parsons was a fearless revolutionary.

The legacy of late Lucy is alive in the Boston area where, one can find the Lucy Parsons Center, a bookstore and gathering place for a wide range of anarchists, political radicals, activists, and generally concerned citizens.
